




## Your Favorite Trope? Romance Did it First

### Romance By the Numbers

**\$1.44 billion in annual sales** (largest book genre in the U.S. − outselling sci-fi, fantasy, and mystery combined).

- 18% of the overall fiction market is romance (nearly 1 in 5 fiction books sold).
- Predominantly women authors and readers: ~82% of romance readers identify as women.
- **Massive output**: Over **7,000 new romance titles** are published each year.
- Oiverse & global: #1 genre on Kindle, with international markets growing fastest in India and Brazil.
- **Crossover reach**: Romance dominates **TikTok/BookTok**, driving backlist titles (like *A Court of Thorns and Roses* and *Icebreaker*) back onto bestseller lists.



Reader loyalty: 50%+ of romance readers buy more than one book per month (voracious!).
